

Master of Arts (MA) Program in Liberal Studies *

The Master of Arts (MA) program in Liberal Studies offers an interdisciplinary curriculum for existing school teachers and those seeking employment in education, mass media, business, and government. This taught program is designed to provide analytical perspectives in the subject areas of “Self and Personal Development”, “Society and Culture”, and “Science, Technology and the Environment”. The program emphasizes critical thinking and information collection and interpretation.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must possess a bachelor's degree from a university or a recognized institution, or have obtained qualifications approved by the University to be equivalent to a first degree. Proficiency in both English and Chinese is important for successful completion of the program.

Program Duration

The program can normally be completed in 14 months in part-time mode. With the approval of the Academic Director, a student may take study leave for no more than one regular term.

Program Fee

The total program fee is HK\$85,000. Students who need to retake failed course(s) must pay the pro-rated fee for the necessary course(s).

Curriculum

Students must take eight courses (24 credits), including at least one course (3 credits) from each of the following four areas. The remaining four courses (12 credits) can be taken in any area. No transfer of credits will be allowed.

a) Foundations of Liberal Studies

b) Self and Personal Development

c) Society and Culture

d) Science, Technology and the Environment

With prior approval of the Academic Director, students may take other courses offered by the School of Humanities and Social Science to fulfill the program requirements.

Part-time students may take a maximum of 12 credits in each term.

Language Requirement

Some courses are taught in English, while others are in Chinese. Students who wish to enroll in courses in which Chinese materials are used and/or Chinese is the teaching medium must be able to demonstrate proficiency in Chinese.

Academic Advising

Upon entering the program, students' progress will be monitored by the Taught Postgraduate Programs Office of the School of Humanities and Social Science.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete the program with a graduation grade average (GGA) of 2.850 or above as required of all postgraduate students at the University.
